The Lambs' Foundation was formed in 1943 as an organized charity under the laws of the State of New York. Created as an offshoot of The Lambs, Inc., America's first professional theatrical club (established in 1874), the Foundation is supported by donations. Its original purpose was to dispense funds for the benefit of needy, sick or destitute members of the entertainment profession. Its purpose has since been expanded to include supporting the creation of new theatrical works and encouraging new theatrical talent.

Supported in part by a bequest from Frederick Loewe's estate, the Foundation benefits many theatrical charities by making small yet much appreciated contributions to selected non-profit education programs and theatre companies. Past recipients have included The Actors' Fund of America, Tony Randall's National Theater, The Pearl Theatre Company, the Episcopal Actors' Guild, Circle-In-The-Square, the Manhattan Theatre Company, the Theatre Hall of Fame, The Oberon Theater Company, St. Clare's Hospital, and several universities.

The Lambs Foundation also encourages the development of new theatrical works through its support of a black box theatrical space at The Lambs®. The space is used by both members of The Lambs and by select outside non-profit theater companies for developmental readings of new plays and musicals.

The Lambs Foundation is recognized by the IRS as a 501(c)(3) organization, which means that contributions to the Foundation are tax deductible to the extent provided by law (please consult your own tax advisor).
